Music Notes...

How can we make it easier for the congregation to join in singing the parts of the Mass? We have created an insert, found inside the front cover of the Heritage Missals that may be used to fully participate at Mass. It will contain the Mass parts that we will sing for the Sundays in Lent: Gospel Acclamation, Holy, Memorial Acclamation, Amen, Lord's Prayer and Lamb of God.

Why do we sing in Latin? There are reasons that we have again opted to sing two Latin responses during Lent. First, many of the older members of St. Joseph's parish actually remember when we sang Latin and did most, if not all the prayers in Latin. Even as changes were made to move the Mass from Latin to the language of the people, the church has defended and encouraged the use of Latin. The "Liturgical Documents" – the 'rules' if you will of how we say Mass and what we do



during the liturgy – speak with passion and conviction of not losing this tradition completely. We have included the "Sanctus" XVIII (Chant) and the "Agnus Dei" XVIII (Chant). We will again intone the "Lord's Prayer" (Chant) in English. All of the above will begin on Ash Wednesday and continue through Good Friday.

West and throughout the centuries, the length of the fast has varied. An important dimension of the Lenten observance was the celebration of Mass by the Holy Father at what are called station churches. The present Missal recalls this custom and “strongly encourages the chief shepherd of the diocese to gather his people in this way.” The Lenten Liturgy also highlights the present restoration of the Scrutiny Masses on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of the season for the catechumens (now called the “elect”), who will be initiated at the Easter Vigil.

Lent (LEHNT): (Middle English lenten; Anglo-Saxon lencten: spring) The forty-day liturgical season of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving in preparation for Easter. In the first three centuries, Lent lasted only two or three days. Later, it grew to three or four weeks. The number forty is first detected in the Canons of Nicaea (A.D. 325), probably to recall Our Lord's forty days in the desert before His public ministry. In the East and
