### The Bella House - Part I

In 2012, two pregnancy counselors at the Birth Choice Women's Center in Dallas, Texas, faced a dilemma. Once a client had chosen life for her baby, then what? Often she was without financial or medical resources to bring her baby to term. Even more challenging, often she had no place to stay during her pregnancy and no one to support her life-affirming, but difficult, decision. Out of this dilemma came a vision, the vision of The Bella House. The word "bella" means beautiful, and as its name implies, The Bella House "celebrates the beauty of every life."

After nearly two years of prayer, fund-raising, and strategic planning, The Bella House in the suburb of Plano opened its doors as a transitional home, a safe haven of hospitality, loving care, and personal growth. Its mission was to reach and support a largely underserved segment of our population, the homeless, pregnant woman. Fundamental to the Bella House mission is the belief that true transformation can only occur in an atmosphere of authentic love, namely, the love of God reflected in the good works of a loving people.

Mothers can come to Bella House when they are newly pregnant, and can stay up to six months after their baby is born. To date, 19 women have come through its doors. A few have left before giving birth because they have found permanent housing, or have reconciled with the baby's father or their families. Every mother has said she is better for having been at The Bella House, even if her stay was not that long. See more about "The Bella House" in next week's bulletin.
