
BIRTHRIGHT

Resurrection, putting into one all the great graces available to all in the celebration of His Mercy. (Before this became known as Feast of Mercy, the Octave Sunday used to be called "Whit Sunday" in the Catholic Church and in some parts of the country the elderly was advised to go to confession.)

Jesus Christ in the 1930s told Saint Faustina: "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon the souls who approach the fountain of My mercy. The soul that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete pardon of sins and punishment. Though its sins be as scarlet I will turn them white as snow." Due to the inconvenience of going to confession during the Feast, Church officials allowed the devotees to go to confessions even five days earlier.

FEAST OF DIVINE MERCY



The second Sunday of Easter is the Feast of Mercy or Mercy Sunday. This popular devotion was declared official by the late Pope John Paul II in 2000 during the canonization of Saint Faustina Kowalska, the late Polish nun and mystic to whom the Lord Jesus Christ

had appeared, conversed and handed down the blue print of the devotion to His mercy and important urgent messages to mankind found in the 600-page spiritual diary of the Saint, "Divine Mercy in My Soul". That same day, the nun's spiritual diary was declared by the late Pope as "Word of God". (It's not a mere coincidence that Pope John Paul II died after the anticipated Feast of Mercy mass, first Saturday, April 2005 when it was already Mercy Sunday in Asia and other parts of the world.)

The Feast of Mercy which falls on the eighth day, the octave, after Easter, sums up the whole paschal mystery of Christ's Passion, Death and



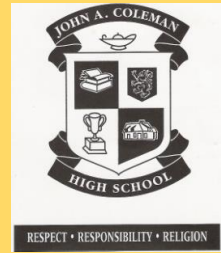
Thank you to our parishioners who graciously donated money towards our Easter Flowers, and the Lamm Family for their decorating expertise. The
