

Why Do We Exchange a Sign of Peace At Mass?

In the middle of the second century, the Sign of Peace occurred just before the Presentation of the Gifts. It is still in that place in the Churches of Milan (Ambrosian Rite) and Spain (Mozarabic Rite). However, by the third century, the Roman Rite had moved the Sign of Peace to after the Lord's Prayer. It was deemed appropriate in that place, since St. Augustine understood the Sign of Peace as related to the petition, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." In this place it also links being in communion with the Body of Christ (the Church) and receiving the Body of Christ in the Eucharist.


